**[HAYES MISSION MEDICAL ASSISTANT
PROGRAM FOR LIBERIA, WEST AFRICA]**

My Dear Friend,

First, I greet you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, without him I am nothing. I will introduce myself as Bishop McCarthy Hayes, Pastor of Pentecostal Tabernacle Church, Cleveland, Ohio. I am also the Chairman of The Hayes Outreach Foundation parent organization to The Hayes Mission School, Liberia West Africa (<http://www.hayesmission.org>) and member of the Bishop's Council, The United Holy Church of America (<http://www.uhca.org>).

In 1968, my wife and I went to Liberia to establish a boarding mission school, centered on the Christian principles and educational enhancement for the people of Liberia, West Africa. The campus (50 acres) eventually became self-sufficient until the 14 years civil war that devastated the country and its economy. We had to flee and close the school. When the war was over in 2003, we returned on a survey/fact finding mission. What we met was unbearable; all of the buildings (13) were destroyed. When we took the findings to the Board of Missions in my organization, they said that they could not invest money of that magnitude in Liberia. So I am left along, but with God's grace and favor, I approach you unashamed for help. I am doing this for the people of Liberia, and would hate to abandon them in their time of need. I have been about to put my income as a pastor to put roofs on 5 buildings, but would love to see the campus in full swing. I have videos, pictures, and any document you may want or need to consider helping me.

As I write this letter, my wife Elder Hayes is currently in Liberia meeting with Alumnus of Hayes Mission School, villagers and interested parties doing outreach to the surrounding townships. Our goal has been to rehabilitate the buildings on campus and to put the roof on the buildings. By the way, the school is free to all that cannot afford. These are just a list of what we need the most; medicine, books, school supplies, (1:10,000 & 1:20,000watts generator, clothes for the villagers, food for the incoming boarding students.

Medicine and first aid is one of Hayes Mission's priorities in Liberia. Many of the children, especially those new to the campus, are easily prone to illness and disease due to their previously poor living conditions. A small scratch or stomach bug can prove very serious in view of the abundance of typhoid, amoebiasis, malaria and other diseases in the region.

Hayes Mission School's medical programme in its Campus Clinic Centre is at its beginning stages and currently composes of a small cabinet that provides basic first aid needs to the children. The employment of a full-time, in-house nurse is desperately needed so that these medicines are well managed and administered by a professional.

Hayes Mission School hopes that the programme can build on these small beginnings to provide a much larger range of medicines and services to the student body. The vision consists of a small and free (or low-cost) medical clinic that can be open to the public. To achieve this Hayes Mission School is looking at the possibility of cool storage for vaccines, abundance of vitamins, worm-treatment drugs and others.

Success of the programme would bring medical help to the children of Hayes Mission School as well as the vulnerable people in the surrounding community.

We invite you the donor on a trip to Liberia to see what your efforts and support has done for the Zohn Town district and Bomi County community. We also invite medical persons and teachers to help in our initial stage of transfer and training.

We need your support to get this project off the ground. We require funds for construction works to move the clinic into a more appropriate building. We are also looking to urgently expand the range of drugs available, including tetanus shots, malaria, yellow fever, chicken pox, ibuprofen, medical stitch, snake anti-venom (globulin), anesthesia, antibiotics and more...as well as medical equipment. We have compiled the most needed Pediatric Medicines below that our nurse has requested. Some of our newer orphans in the surrounding villages show signs of malnourishment like red hair or enlarged internal organs because they come from an arid region and did not have enough to eat.

We have experienced a long 14 years of civil war and most of these children have lost their families (we are their only hope). The closest medical facility is 20 miles away and is ill-equipped, lacks availability of bed, and lacks the medicines needed and in most cases the doctors don't get to see these critical patients in their time of need. These children may need special medicines not mentioned here.
